E must always remember that Jesus is God the Son, made man for us. We must do so, even if this must make us wonder how Jesus could be tempted, as we are told, in detail, in today's gospel.

We are told it for a very good reason; to help us think how he 'humbled himself, to share in our humanity' as we say in the offertory at Mass.

We all have thoughts, and wishes, and dreams, and fears, in our minds. In fact we have to. It's a necessary part of our humanity.

We can be ashamed of some and even alarmed at them; but this human 'dreaming' is very important. All the 'man-made' things around, buildings, books, clothes, started, as someone's dream.

And even the dreams we might be ashamed of should make us think. We must examine them, and get to know ourselves, humbly, and better.

We could dream of simply getting everything we wanted just by wishing ('stones-into-bread'); or of obtaining power, by playing up to everyone's pride ('worship-me'); of a false, childish-safety feeling ('catch-me-I'm-jumping'). It's all-too-human to think this.

Jesus let himself be tempted in all these ways; and so he showed us how to reject temptations — by knowing, and remembering, the many things said in Scripture.

We come to find these holy writings very helpful for this indeed.

The trouble always is that many people don't even see the need to recognise 'temptations', and resist them. They think it's only natural, to have these silly and sometimes quite nasty thoughts.

So they never really come to understand what help there is, and what Scripture is, and what it is for.

Jesus allowed himself to be tempted to show us the truth in this.
