# Fridays in May

ost people can readily see that they ought to do penance for themselves. The idea of doing penance for other people may sound a little strange, but it is of course a most Catholic idea. St Paul tells us to 'bear one another's burdens, and so fulfil the law of Christ' (Galatians 6.2). Part of being in the communion of saints is that we can do precisely this: pray for each other, and do penance for each other.

In the early Church, the three biggest sins were murder, adultery and apostasy. For such sins, a heavy penance was imposed. Often a lifetime of penance, before receiving absolution on one's deathbed. Their fellow Christians used to cry out to the bishop, 'indulgentia' (mercy, clemency) and would sometimes do penance on behalf of sinners. Those in prison awaiting martyrdom would write a *libellus pacis*, a certificate asking that their sufferings should count as penance for the apostates. These are early forms of what we now call indulgences.

More importantly, it has always been Catholic practice to intercede for each other in this way. We not only pray for each other, but we do penance for ourselves and others. Is that fair? Not in the strict sense of justice, no. But what we hope for from God is mercy, as we say at Mass, 'Do not consider what we truly deserve, but grant us your forgiveness'. As we hope for mercy ourselves, so we ought to be merciful to others.

The bishops of England and Wales have reminded us last week that these 'others' include paedophiles and those who have brought scandal to the Church. They ask us to pray before the Blessed Sacrament especially on Fridays in May, as penance and reparation for the evil done. Is this an admission of our own guilt? No. Should we do it? Yes. Why? Because that is how God's love in the heart of the Church works: 'And if one member suffer any thing, all the members suffer with it; or if one member glory, all the members rejoice with it.' (1 Corinthians 12.26).

At Holy Cross we will have exposition and adoration on Fridays in May, from 10:30am till 12:30pm. At every Mass on Friday we will pray together the 'Act of Reparation to the Sacred Heart' (please take a sheet). You can of course pray it yourselves at any time, but on Fridays we will pray it together. And above all we will pray for the victims.
