Abortion Conference 23rd - 24th October 2007. A major conference to liberalise abortion is being held in London at the QEII Conference Centre in Westminster on 23-24 October. Those attending include Government minister Gareth Thomas MP and Jon Snow (the newsreader). It centres around the Government's proposed Human Tissues and Embryos Bill, through which the pro-abortion lobby aims to establish abortion on demand.
