

“Ite Missa est” or “What’s next?”

Have you, like me, found it strange that the verbs ‘to raise’ and ‘to raze’ sound the same, but have very different meanings? To raze a building means you don’t have a building any more! English can be fun and, well, daft. Our language has a word ‘mass’ and our religion has ‘the Mass’. They, too, aren’t the same thing. The OED says ‘mass’ is “a coherent body of matter of indefinite shape ... a dense aggregation (that’s, ‘collection’) of objects ... a large number”. I’m saying that’s not what is meant by you at Holy Mass ... though it’s nice when you are a large number and I’d rather have you coherent than dense and the collection is appreciated. But those things aren’t what makes the Mass. It’s not called ‘Mass’ because you ‘aggregate’, become a gathering together of disparate elements (though, look around, that is probably what you see! You Holy Crossers are catholic with a lowercase ‘c’ too).

It’s called Mass because of what happens at the end, not because of what we look like as we arrive. The final words of the Mass in Latin are ‘*ite missa est*’ which becomes ‘go’ (*ite*), ‘the Mass’ (*missa*), ‘is’ (*est*), ‘ended’ ... there’s no Latin for ‘ended’. So, it’s ‘go, the Mass is’.

Missa is from the verb *mittere* which means ‘to send’. Other words come from this verb ... mission and missionary, missive, missile. They are all things ‘sent’. And the final words of the Mass are the ‘dismissal’. They are the words that send you out of the church (small ‘c’), but those words don’t dismiss you from being the (big ‘c’) Church. You carry on being that. You are ‘sent’ to take what you’ve just celebrated into the world you live in. The Mass is called that because it’s about being sent.

The Nottingham diocese has a new name for its Pastoral Plan: “Handing on our Faith”. Some of us are discussing what this might mean for Holy Cross. We know that lots of you go out and do lots to put your faith into action in our city. You hand on your faith in many ways, making it active. Others will want to know how they might do more. Will you let the Parish Council know what you are doing? And when you have, we can let those who want to get more active know what the possibilities are.

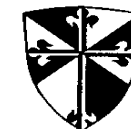

Gift Aid. As you probably know, in his last budget as Chancellor of the Exchequer, Gordon Brown announced that the basic rate of income tax would be reduced from 22% to 20%, with effect from 6 April 2008. Although that was good news for many taxpayers, it was bad news for charities, because the Gift Aid we reclaim was to go down from 28.2% (i.e. 22/78) to 25% (i.e. 20/80). The good news for charities is that Alistair Darling in the budget announced that the "Gift Aid rate" would be unhooked from the basic rate of income tax and stay at 22% for the next three tax years. So at least until 5 April 2011, charities will continue to be able to claim back 28.2% on Gift Aid donations.
