

**T**ODAY'S Gospel with Jesus confronting the Pharisees can look quite unpleasant and wrong. It can foster a lot of hatred - of Jews, of clergy, of authority in any form, and most of all, our modern prejudice in favour of the noble lonely 'individual' up against 'the crowd'; worse, the 'simple' good person before all the 'clever' people. We can admire, and try to imitate, the skill of Jesus in dealing with the situation He was placed in. It was a situation, a terrible bind, for His people: to collaborate with the occupying forces, or not. Of course He could point out that they were already collaborating, in using the enemy money. He could make the strong point that all this was quite unimportant, compared with our real business - of collaborating with God. We ourselves are His walking, talking, images - 'coins'. Or, we should be.

And of course His accusers would collaborate with the Roman authorities worst of all - why the Herod party is mentioned - in having Him crucified, in their barbaric, pagan Roman way. We love seeing others' hypocrisy - as a distraction and relief from having to notice our own? So, Gospels should be read and heard with great care.

Just reading or hearing them we go 'along with them'.

We are not just to be 'Jesus' in them. We are to be - Mary, and Joseph, the disciples, the women, shepherds, Magi, John the Baptist, the crowds and yes, the sinners, and the Pharisees, and Herod, and Pilate, and all.

When we read the Passion, we in the congregation are made to shout the words of the crowd. 'Crucify Him!' Our lives can be almost a condemnation of Him and His 'kingdom'. If this strikes us, we can be quite terrified; at first; until we realise that we read the whole Gospel as the year goes on. We can be in, at the end, with the other disciples. We know the whole story. We believe.

'Praying and praising God in His temple' we find Peace.
