

THE Gospel raises many questions, as all gospels do. We spend our whole life trying to find the answers. What does it mean that Jesus 'taught with authority', and not like the scribes, the clergy of His day? And how did the spirit in the man possessed, first of all know who Jesus was, but then didn't follow Him? We make the excuse of ignorance, for the so many, who don't seem to take religion seriously. Could it be that, as with this 'unclean' spirit, there is no excuse of ignorance? They know who Jesus is? They just don't want to follow Him? In fact they find Him an enemy to all they want to do? There's room for lots of thoughts and questions, and even some actions here! Are we to 'teach with authority', like Jesus? Will people have any exercise of 'authority' these days? They think we are all free, each entitled to our own opinions and point of view; and all to be respected, in our 'civilised' society.

But if we conform to this way of thinking, we will be unable to do anything.

Is it that we are afraid of any 'convulsions', like the ones the man was thrown into, when the spirit was ordered out of him? The Gospel is, however, for us to hear, and act on, in any ways we can. We can learn (and the best way to learn, I have found, is to teach!) the truths: of God, His Glory; His Kingdom.

For this we have to keep coming to church; to pray; and learn for ourselves, and celebrate, and demonstrate; to each other, to Leicester and to the world!



Red Cross Appeal for Refugees & Asylum Seekers. The Red Cross list of items needed to support these destitute and vulnerable people has been updated, with changes underlined:

- ◆ Dried items: rice (RICE IS URGENTLY NEEDED), pasta, cous-cous, maize mealie-meal, sugar, salt, porridge, cooking oil, flour (self-raising), spices, palenta, mashed potato (Smash), tea, coffee, powdered milk, water, fruit juice, semolina;
- ◆ Tins: fish, meat and pulses; baked beans, soup, fruit, rice pudding, sauces, vegetables;
- ◆ Pre-prepared food: cereal bars, chocolate, biscuits, nuts, crisps, pot noodles;
- ◆ Baby items: nappies (sizes 2-4), baby wipes, food, milk, lotion, talc, clothing, equipment;
- ◆ Toiletries: toothpaste, tooth brush, soap, moisturiser, shampoo, conditioner, toilet paper.
