

Mediocrity and Bananas

FR Matthew Rigney OP died seven years ago. Some of you may remember him. The young friars certainly recall him with much fondness. He was the source of many wonderful gems, such as, 'Butter. There's no nicer flavourer my dear!' and 'Do you know what Christmas means to me, my dear? Why, it's the birthday of Our Lord!' Like many young friars I used to look after him when he was unwell, going into his room fragrant with the heady aroma of bananas and ammonia (I'll say no more). During those visits, Matty would chat away, taking an interest in us, the priory, the latest ice cream in the freezer.

Matty was particularly insightful on sin. He noted that most of us are never very imaginative with our sins, that no matter how awful our sins might be, they were never clever or creative. And that's the nature of sin – it is inherently mediocre.

Goodness, on the other hand (he noted) was thwarted not by mediocrity but by perfection. When perfection is held up as a goal, it prompts feelings of can't strive, won't strive. We mustn't confuse holiness with perfection – mostly because our ideas of perfection are not perfect, and are not holy. Holiness, real holiness, lies in death. And by death Matty meant the acceptance of our limits, of our place, of our insignificance. When we have laid aside the exaltation of our name, our dignity, our talents, our contribution, our voice – then we begin to accept death.

It's not easy for us. Even when we acknowledge our weaknesses, we want respectable, decent, manageable ones. At job interviews now, when the candidate is asked to state his or her weaknesses, it's always a strength that is declared: 'I'm too zealous, I'm too hard-working, etc'. Our real weaknesses are not nice; they are pathetic, they are disgraceful. Why? Because that's what we are like. We don't like admitting it because it hurts, it feels like we're being rejected, or worse, that we're unlovable.

Only One is Good. Only One is True. Only One loves us as what we are – loves us and wants to love us into becoming what we were made to be. It is a blessing for St Paul to say that God is glorified in his weakness. Not in his nice, respectable weaknesses, but in his real ones. It is a blessing – that fact alone should shock us to the core!

Only when the glory belongs to God alone, only then is there perfection. Only then is there real holiness, and – born of pain and fire – only then is there lasting beatitude.

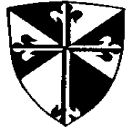

- ◆ Tins: fish, meat, pulses, baked beans, soup, fruit, rice pudding, sauces, vegetables;
- ◆ Pre-prepared food: cereal bars, chocolate, biscuits, nuts, crisps, pot noodles;
- ◆ Baby items: nappies (sizes 2-4), baby wipes, food, milk, lotion, talc, clothing, equipment;
- ◆ Toiletries: toothpaste, tooth brush, soap, moisturiser, shampoo, conditioner, toilet paper.
