

Reflections of an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion

I MUST confess a dark secret. I am a hesitant Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion. Perhaps hesitant is the wrong word, because it suggests a lagging behind in the pews when one is called upon to help. Maybe 'uncertain' is better. This uncertainty increased up to the training weekend at Crich and remained after it. It was the usual - how can I be good enough for this (I wasn't), am I getting in the way of the priests (probably), am I causing any scandal? Controversially, chiefly, how is it that non-ordained people can be allowed to distribute the Sacred Species, the Most Holy Body and Blood of our Saviour, as though we were ourselves priests? Though I grew up with it, I've increasingly found it hard to understand - hence my uncertainty at taking on this role.

We can, of course, because the Church has declared that we can. It is not because we are priests or a strange hybrid of priest and laity. We remain laity, but we are called to our own special ministry. Our dignity does not consist in imitating the life and vocation of consecrated religious, or in trying to do what priests and deacons do. But still, by the grace of our baptism, we can assist others in the Church, to collaborate with them in the Church's mission.

There are a number of changes going on in our church. Actually they are not changes: they merely reflect the current norms of the Church, allowing us to express the faith and love with which we must all regard the Eucharist, the 'Sublime Sacrament'. *Redemptionis Sacramentum* states, "The Eucharist is too great a gift to tolerate ambiguity or depreciation. It is therefore necessary that some things be corrected or more clearly delineated so that in this respect as well the Eucharist will continue to shine forth in all its radiant mystery."

The extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion collaborate in the ministry of the clergy. Our vocation here is to be Christ's hands and feet, to serve Christ in the sick and housebound. We are not different from the other baptised laity, but are commissioned for a time for a specific ministry. We receive Communion the same as everyone else, and not with the priests; we don't give Communion to ourselves; we take Communion straight from the Mass to the sick, making them share in the Mass that was just celebrated.

Our lay vocation is oriented outwards, from the liturgy away to those removed from it. We laity are the yeast in the dough, bringing the fruits of the Mass to those who cannot be there.
