C HILDREN often ask me, Why did Jesus have to suffer, so much, and die?

Difficult to answer! Even more difficult than, Why do we have to suffer and die? I have been taught in theology that there is a whole rainbow of reasons for Jesus' suffering and dying. One is — it may be strange for us to think like this about Our Lord — that He showed necessary virtues on the Cross. These virtues help us. We imitate them. They save us. He shows we need them — Faith in God, Patience, Forgiveness, Concern for others.

He begins it all today with a dramatic entry into Jerusalem, acting out old Prophecies, that a mild 'king on a donkey' would take over Jerusalem for God. Children seemed to understand something of this. They were taught to throw sacred boughs of palm at the altar, but instead threw them at His feet. They shouted out, to Him, the holy Prophets' words of praise, to God. When the priests summoned Him to answer for all this He reminded them of other Prophecies, when a Man God would come in might and majesty. He so disturbed them, that they couldn't face the implications of this, and condemned Him to death for blasphemy. He submitted. Again, to act out more and more Prophecies. He showed us how God works, and wins, in ways we can imitate, to be saved — Faith, Patience, Forgiveness, Concern.
