E have this wonderful Gospel each year to tell us how Jesus, back from the dead, blessed His followers, then left them, moving up into the sky, where a cloud hid Him. 'Angel' figures appeared, to promise that He would return, to rule us all, in 'justice, love and peace'; forever.

It is what every good person longs to hear. It gives the hope that we need, to live by. If we don't want to hear, and believe, there may be something wrong with the way we want to live. St Paul will mock it: 'Eat, drink and be merry — for tomorrow we die'. Or, are we just sad, 'living lives of quiet desperation'?

Especially today; when we all learn Science at school, with the picture of tiny 'planet earth' in the vast open universe; and no 'heavens above' it at all; only endless, cold, dark space, sprinkled with burning stars, lifeless planets.

We may then wonder. Where has Jesus really gone? Where is He, now?

A good question, which may help us to see everything in a different way.

Scientists themselves are talking very strangely today; of 'relativity' in time-and-space, past-and-future together; of it all with more-orless 'probability'; and how, by looking, we give 'reality' reality; everything really being made, around us; just as we see it. When we say in the creed: 'through Him all things were made' it may involve our humanity; and His — infinitely more of course.

In our old churches we 'pictured' this all very strikingly. Angels wore wings. Saints wore haloes, and sat on clouds. Blazing gold showed that it was all well above this 'earth'. That dark, 'valley of tears', was left, far, down below. We can't feel like this now. We understand earth. We love beauty in nature. We can't, and won't, fly away from it. Jesus remains; not up 'above' us, now — we were told not to look up to the sky — but where our lives take us: 'ahead'.
