TODAY we see Jesus off to a very bad start in his 'home town'. There is a terrible lesson here. 'Familiarity brings contempt' we say. This contempt can be crippling to us all. It prevents many good things from happening.

We are punished, as we will have made a misery of the world around us.

There is a way out; and we were told it – 'Repent, and believe the Gospel'.

But there are great mysteries in this gospel. How could Jesus be hindered from doing miracles? How is God amazed at lack of faith? Mark's gospel is the most human-all-too-human of the gospels. The other gospel writers let us see Jesus acting as God, the Son made man for us; but Mark almost pointedly lets Jesus look very, very human, in among all the difficulty of believing even everyone around Him had. And don't we, also, these days?

Mark is helping us come to believe. In his gospel is the unforgettable cry of an unhappy man, 'I believe – help my unbelief!' This is the state we all are in, until we make progress in real faith. We move, from being needy, to knowing our needs, then being able to think they could be met, even to feel they should be met, and so to look for where they would be met. We find this, in the Church. We hear His Gospel, here. At last, in daily life, we learn, in our prayers, to talk to Him, ourselves, and to listen to Him.

So, He answers our prayers. For we grow to learn our real needs. They are faith and hope and love. They come to us always, and more and more, in our prayers. We find God hardly ever answers prayers for other things. We find out why, as we get to know the mysteries of His life, and – ours.



A date for your diary. On Sunday 13 September, our patronal feast, the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, Bishop Malcolm will preside at the 11:00 Mass, after which he will consecrate our new bells. This will be followed by a Parish Party. More details in due course.
